## Overview of 2022

In 2021, ICA learned that 70% of carbon emissions are from buildings in Chicago. **ICA** prioritizes the environment for sustainability bv beina a demonstration for other buildings in Chicago moving towards being carbon free.

How does a 100-year-old building truly take a carbon free journey that benefits the environment? The GreenRise has been on the journey for ten years and is monthly sharing its journey with other Uptown buildings and two other cities nationally.

The voice of Greta Grunberg has been ringing in our ears, "Our house is on fire." ICA is committed to the urgency of this message.

By the end of 2022, all Chicago programs will target the Uptown community to catalyze a carbon free lifestyle. Taking care of the Earth with effective action is our main priority.

### Chicago

#### **GreenRise to Receive Two Million TIF Grant**

In 2014, 485 solar panels were installed on the GreenRise roof, providing 25% of its electricity for the building. On November 16, 2022, the Chicago City Council passed a \$2,000,000 Tax Increment Financing (TIF) grant that will become part of the financial package for closing on the GreenRise Restoration Project. The Restoration Project will drastically reduce the building's energy consumption and carbon footprint, including additional solar panels. It is anticipated that construction will begin in Summer 2023. One step closer to #carbonfree2035!

#### **Energy Star Renewal**

Each year, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) ENERGY STAR program honors businesses and organizations that have made outstanding contributions to protecting the environment through superior energy achievements. ICA GreenRise has received the Energy Star Renewal annually since 2014. In 2022, ICA's energy score was 88, meaning it is more energy efficient than 88 percent of similar properties nationwide.



### Chicago

#### **Carbon Free Uptown**

The Carbon Free Uptown program addresses the climate crisis, economic inequality, and racial injustice, creating a framework and demonstration for Uptown and the other 76 communities of Chicago. In 2022, the Carbon Free Building Demonstrations Collaborative invited other buildings in Uptown to become carbon free. Lakeside Square Apartments, Sarah's Circle, and the Uplift Community High School joined the Collaborative, meeting monthly to share learnings and resources. The Illinois Green Alliance (IGA) and Neighborhood Power Project have provided financial and technical resources to buildings in the Collaborative.

#### **Decarbonization Policies**

The Chicago Building Decarbonization Working Group Report was published by the Mayor on October 13, 2022. ICA collaborated and provided beneficial insights for the report that included twenty-six recommendations. Now, the ICA is assisting buildings and helping create city-wide policies.

### **Technology of Participation (ToP) Network**

The ToP Network is a volunteer-led membership association that expands the use of the Technology of Participation (ToP) methods nationally and globally. Highlights in the <u>ToP 2022 Annual Report</u>:

- Measures of their success in membership, income, and conference attendance are all at record levels;
- Delivery of 167 ToP courses with 1,998 attendees virtually and in-person;
- 206 active members with 126 Certified ToP Facilitators and 61 ToP Trainers.

The ToP Network anticipates its strategic anchors for 2023 will be to:

- Increase external awareness and advance ToP facilitating and training;
- Refine communication systems;
- Support members (professional development, mentorship, communities practice); and
- Deepen connections between members.

### Erness Wright-Irvin ToP Trainer Fellowship Program

Erness Wright-Irvin was an active ToP Network member, facilitator, and trainer in New Orleans in early 2000. Her smile was infectious, and eagerness to support others in moving forward. She was a local host of the ToP Network Cathering in 2019. She died



of the ToP Network Gathering in 2018. She died in November 2020.

In 2022 the ToP Network created The Erness Wright-Irvin Fellowship Program to enhance the opportunity for community-minded individuals who are Black, indigenous, or persons of color to become ToP trainers and to enrich the pool of ToP Trainers in the USA. The program has two scholarships that will underwrite the training journey of individuals.

### **USA**

#### Denver, Colorado

In 2022 Accelerate Neighborhood Climate Action (ANCA) collaborated with residents in three Denver neighborhoods who identified as having "some of the worst air quality in the United States." These neighborhoods have environmental burdens like unchecked industrial pollution, highways built through their residential areas, low property values and a high percentage of respiratory illness.

At the December Climate Action Forum, residents articulated ten priority vision areas and action planning has continued. These three neighborhoods have a tough road to tackle their challenges. Having a plan for them to work together toward a better future has the power to sustain their commitments.



#### Redlands, California

In March 2022 the Redlands
ANCA program began a five-week
speakers' series on the local impacts
of climate change with speakers
from the University of Redlands and
the City. This approach was needed
to increase community awareness
and understanding of the climate
crisis and to identify concerned
community members.

The event led to strong City of
Redlands and University
partnerships. Highly committed
volunteers hold monthly
educational events under ANCA
Redlands' Resilient Living: Facing
Climate Challenges Together
program. By the end of the year
recruitment began for 2023 Climate
Action Forums.

### Partnerships with Ithaca, NY and Menlo Park, CA

Since May 2022, ICA has had monthly Zoom calls with Ithaca and Menlo Park about sharing ways to accelerate becoming carbon free. Both cities have legislation committed to being carbon free by 2030 (ahead of Chicago's 2035). #### **Global Archives**

Archive volunteers scan files in nine collections on the Global Research Network Website with stories and learnings accessible to anyone.

In July and December Archive Sojourns the volunteers reviewed all of Africa, India and Latin America files and prepared them for scanning. A Memorials page was designed to celebrate the lives of ICA colleagues who are no longer with us. Throughout the year, Ed Feldmanis scans files four days a week; and Wendell Refior creates links to add to the website. Now we have 5,500 documents available to the world!

#### **Global Schedule**

In 2021 the <u>Global Schedule</u> was developed in Chicago as a means for global research, training, interchange and conversation. The Schedule hosted approximately 100 events with 1,500 participants. In December of 2021 and 2022 we hosted global conversations on zoom to honor the past year and anticipate the year to come.

#### **Global Fund**

The Global Fund is focusing on African Climate Change. In 2022, ten African nations (Benin, Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe) completed and climate change demonstration project and, therefore, have on the ground projects to show people how to address climate change. These demonstrations helped each nation build new partnerships.

Each country made 50 visits to their government agencies, the private sector, and other local NGOs asking for their insights about fighting climate change at the local level. They also asked, "Are you doing projects we could use in our work, or would you help support our work?"

The Global Fund engages communities to understand the challenges we face today in what Boulding called The Great Transition.


